POSTER THEME

We want people to have a connection to the trees in their backyard, as well as the trees in the state parks and national forests. We all have a connection to the trees that provide wood for our homes, furniture and cork for the center of our baseballs. We can also thank trees that help clean the air we breathe. Trees play an important role in each of our lives; including the lives of many farmers across the nation and the food those farmers produce every day. There is a lot to learn about forests!

The winning student will be awarded a \$20.00 cash prize during the visit.

The winning student's entire class will receive a visit from the Conservation District.

The visit includes a 15 minute watershed model demonstration and a pizza party!

CONTEST RULES

- ⓧ The title "Forests for People: More Than You Can Imagine" or "Forests for People" must be on the poster. (Do not use any other title or theme)
- ⓧ Any media may be used to create the two-dimensional poster, including: paint, crayon, colored pencil, charcoal, paper and all other materials.
- ⓧ Poster size must be between 8.5" x 11" and 22" x 28."
- ⓧ All posters must have a completed entry form taped to the back of the poster. **No staples please!**
- ⓧ The contest is open to all fourth, fifth and sixth grade students.
- ⓧ All posters must be created by an individual rather than a team of students.

POSTER EVALUATIONS

Posters entered into the contest are reviewed by the District and one winner will be selected. There is no entry limit per school, but only one poster per student. Posters are evaluated on the following criteria:

Conservation message - 50%

Visual effectiveness - 30%

Originality - 10%

Universal appeal - 10%

The winning poster will go on to the state competition. The poster that wins the state competition will advance to the national competition.
